### **Related activities / processes**

- For better coordination of refugee activities, a WASH platform was formed
  - Platform is lead by MWE. UNHCR and UNICEF are co-leads
  - Platform brings together all CSO's working in the refugee and host communities environment
  - There are monthly status meetings held under the WASH platform
    - Matters discussed combine water supply, sanitation, hygiene and environment and catchment management (lately)

# **Key Challenges**

- Incorporating the concept of catchment management planning and source protection in the process of water supply –
  - CSO's are yet to appreciate this requirement.
- A better O&M arrangement is one that will see tariffs introduced in the refugee settlements.
  - A wider stakeholder engagement is required (MWE, OPM, UNHCR etc)
  - The manner in which this will be introduced. How the refugees will pay and how much is still a question
  - If subsidies are to be proposed how will this be implemented in the host communities.
