Detail of Undertaking No. 8

- Finalize and commence implementation of the one source per village /cell strategy (Central, NWSC, District Local Government) by the end of FY 2018/19.
- Thematic Working Group Equity and Access Chaired by Eng. Joseph Eyatu Oriono

Progress in achieving outputs

- The Uganda Water Atlas 2017 was launched and is in publication, also on www.mwe.go.ug
- District Water and Sanitation Investment Plans (DIPs) completed for all the 122 districts
- SCAP100 under implementation by NWSC, to report on progress by June 2018

Progress in achieving outputs

- Revised 2018 Guidelines to districts developed and agreed with ULGFC; DIPs have been adopted as planning tools by districts in budgeting + lobbying for resources
- Exploring alternative sources of financing with Exim Banks, Rotary International, Private Sector
- 124 villages without a water source served as of June 2017 in addition to new other water sources in areas already served

Related activities / processes

- This Undertaking is related to the NWSC SCAP100 and continuous guidelines issued to DLGs for service coverage improvement.
- Related to the consultancy to develop the Strategic Sector Investment Plan (SSIP) and the SSIM Model for the Water and Environment Sector to guide investments up to the year 2030

Key Challenges

- Simple technologies to reach the unserved are almost exhausted, now only those with high per capita investment costs (piped rural water supplies)
- Need for expansion of existing town water supplies to reach unserved cells as the designs were focused on small supply areas
- The investment requirements are not comparable with the available funding; to achieve only NDP targets we need over 24 years in rural areas
