#### Major water supply technologies



#### Challenges

- Dwindling resource envelope (FYs 2016/17& 2017/18. With current funding SDGs can't be met.
- Creation of new administrative units (districts, sub-counties & villages) – impacting on budgets & planning)
- Natural disasters damage to water supply infrastructure (e.g. Bukonde GFS).
- Phasing of projects due to limited funding (GFSs)
- IFMS challenges e.g. network failure, delay in loading of budgets by MOFPED.

# Challenges (Cont'd)

 Budget allocation towards office operations and mobilisation activities is insufficient and has great implications on sustainability for instance this FY no budget for reactivation of WUCs, only 2 DWSCC meetings to be held and 2 extension staff meetings were planned.

#### **Untapped potentials**

 Abundance of surface water resources e.g. rivers & streams for promotion of Irrigation schemes for Water for Production

#### Recommendations

- Increased funding to the sector
- MWE should reward districts with outstanding performance (funds absorption capacity, value for money in investments, timely implementation & reporting) by increasing their funding
- Special consideration for the water stressed areas (Namanyonyi, Nakaloke, Namabasa, Bufumbo & Bubyangu)
