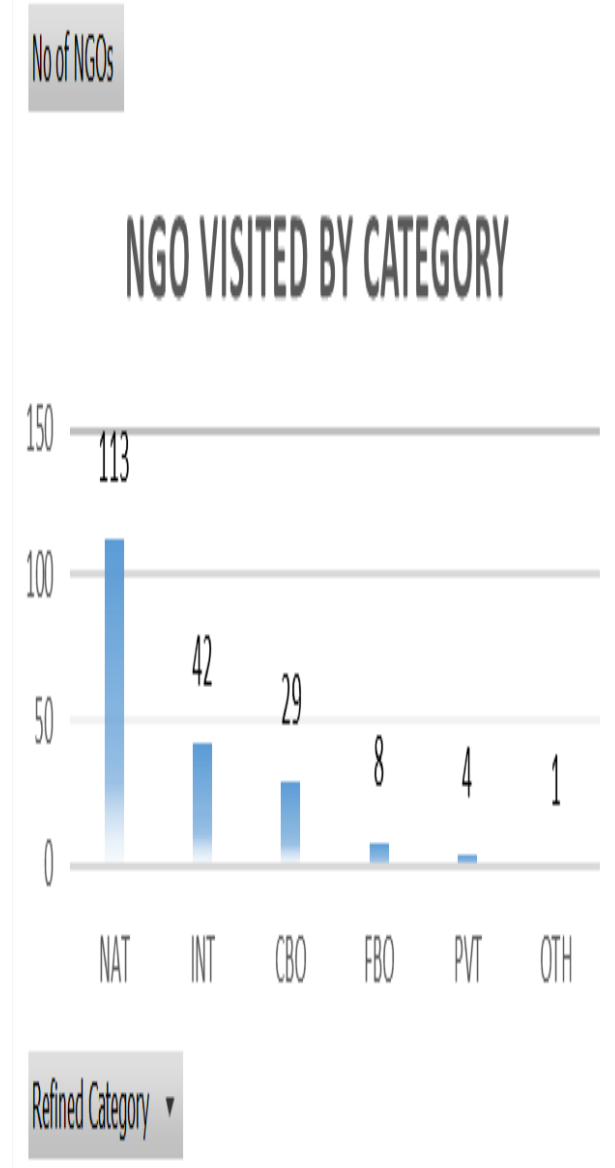


WASH and Environment CSO Mapping

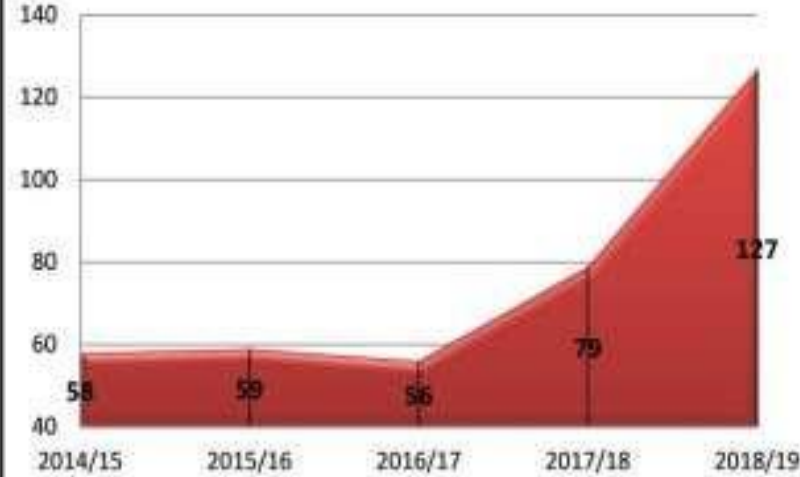

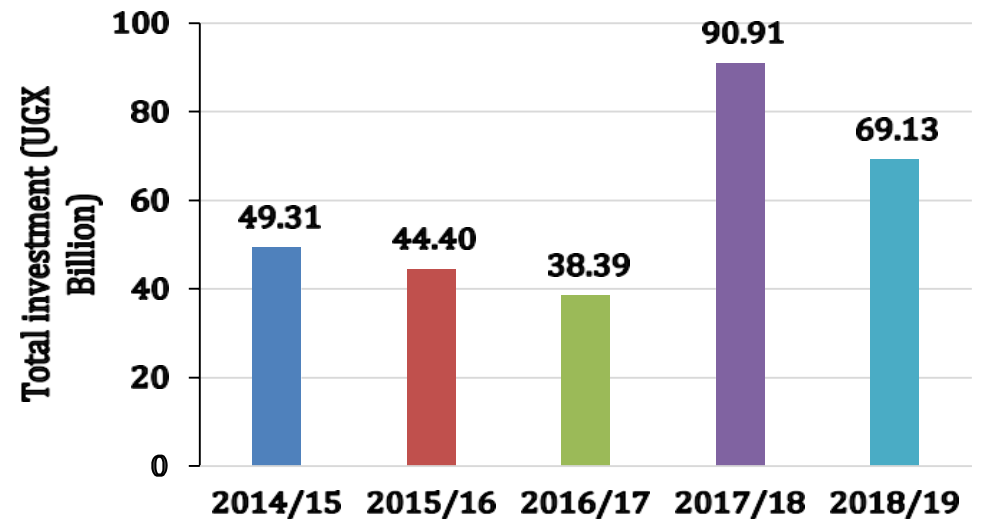
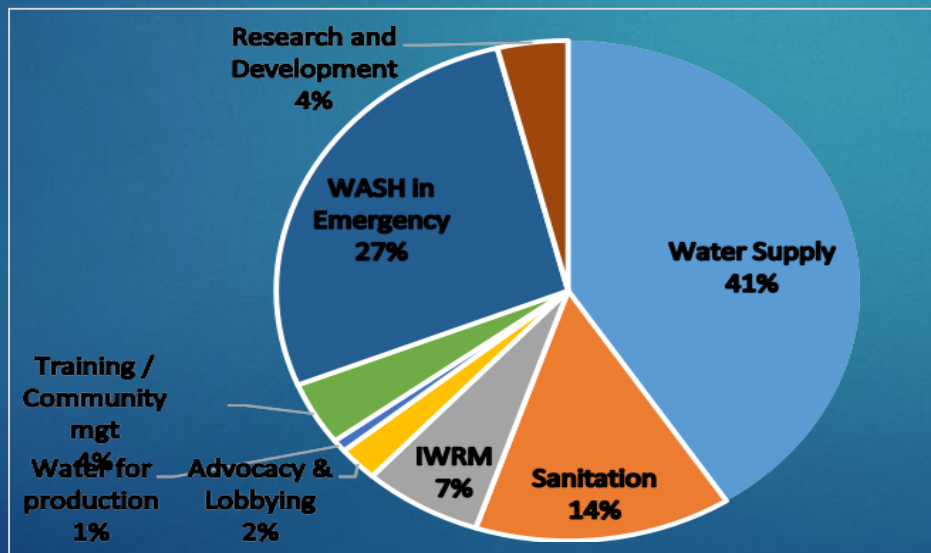
Number of CSOs that reported



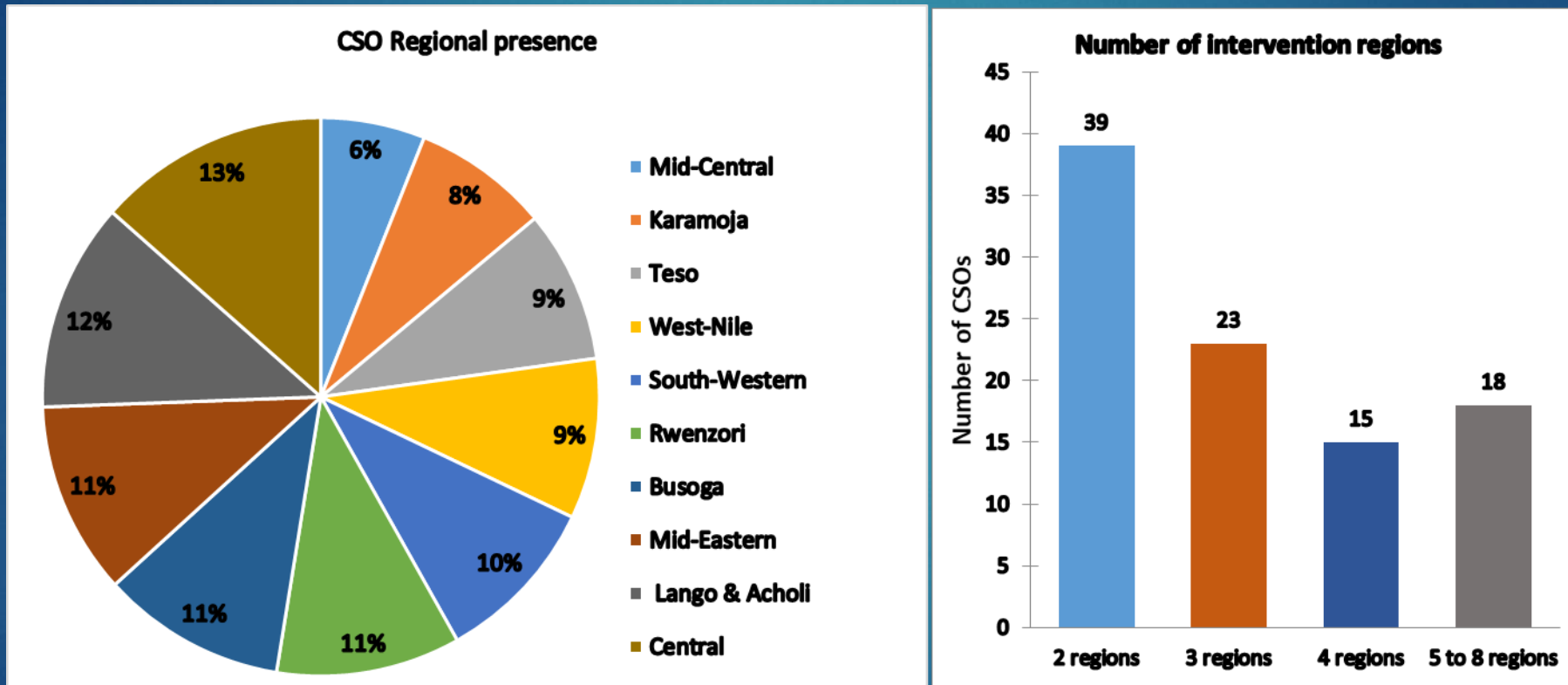
CSO reporting trends - FY 2015 to FY 2019



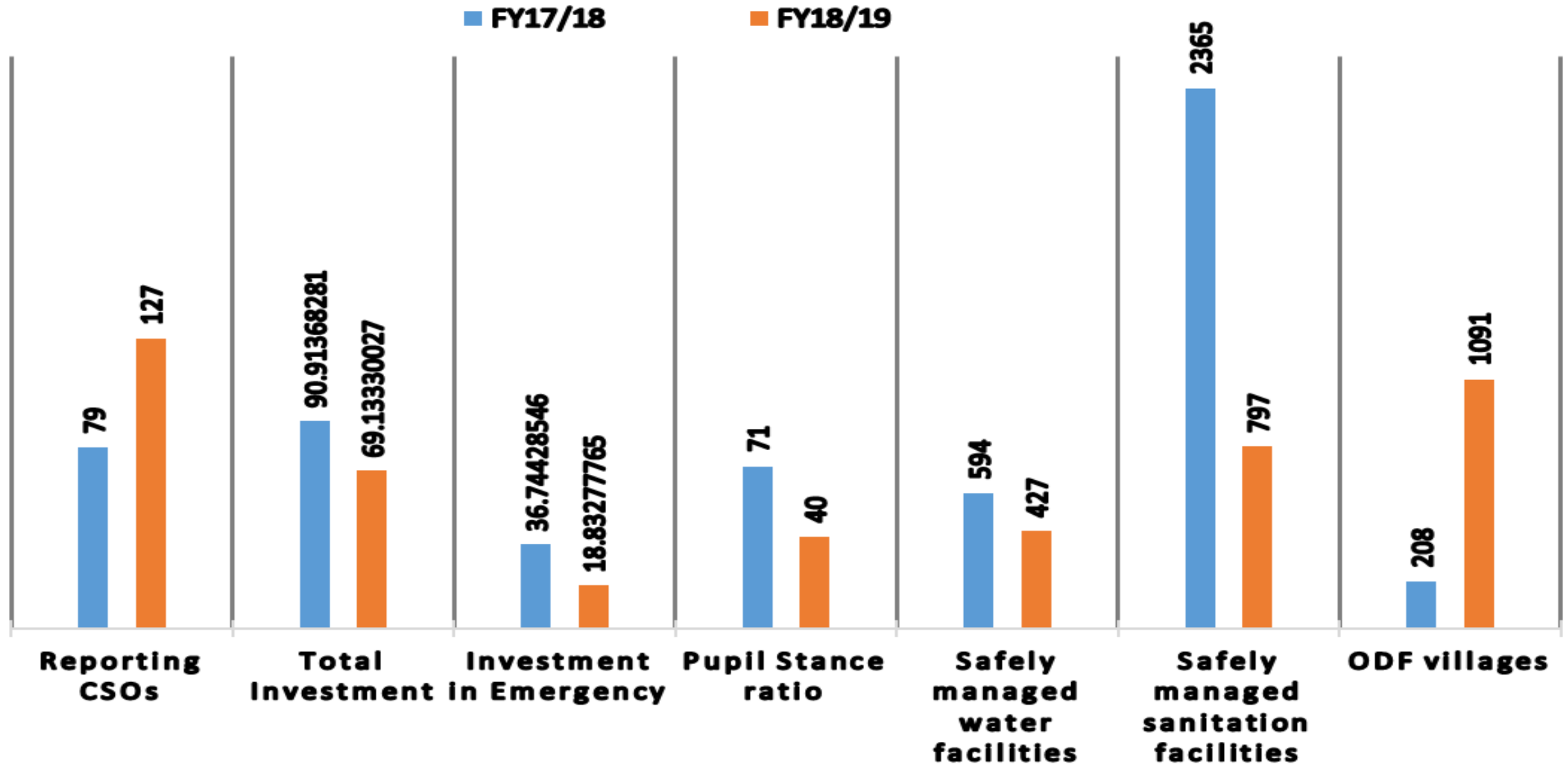
- ▶ 127 CSOs

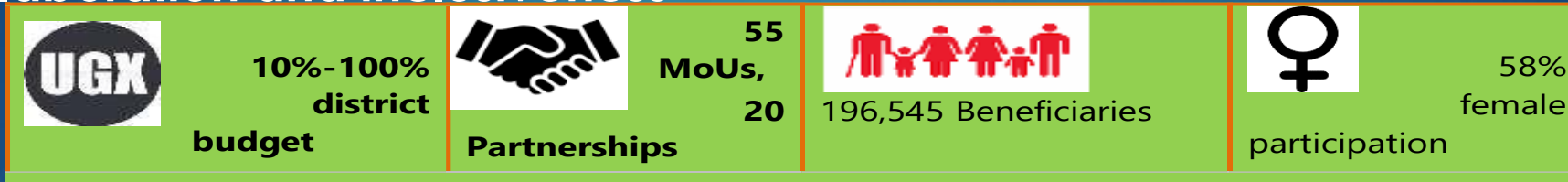

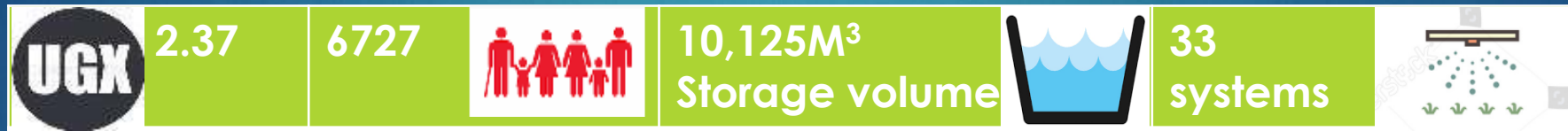

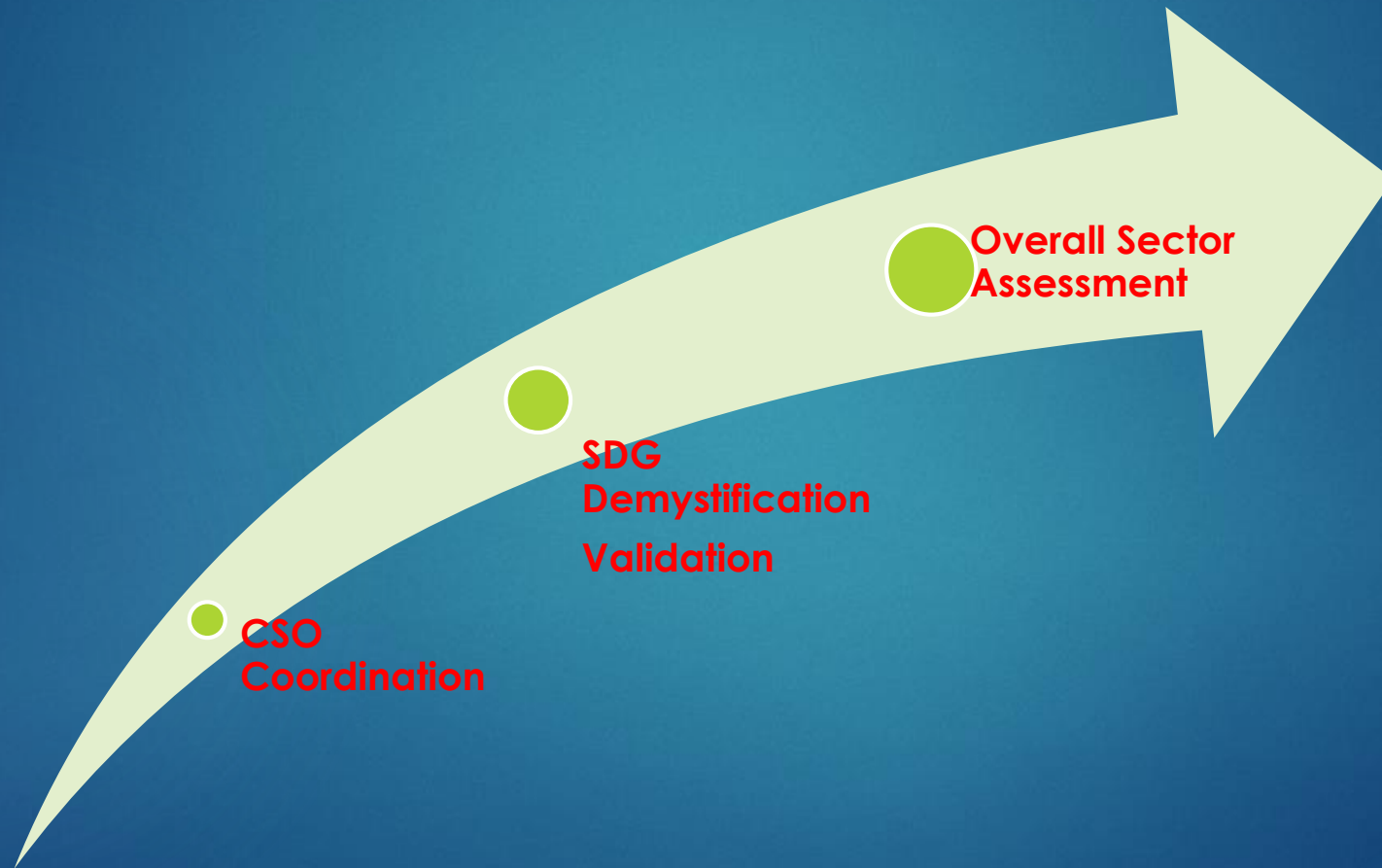
